## Adverbs to Express Time, Cause and Place

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Adverbs tell us more about a verb. They can be used to express time e.g. We need to leave for the airport <u>soon</u>. They can also be used to express cause e.g. Toby didn't wake up on time and <u>consequently</u> he was late for school. They can also be used to express place e.g. The children played <u>outside</u>.
