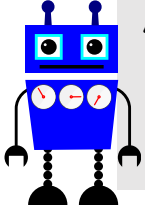


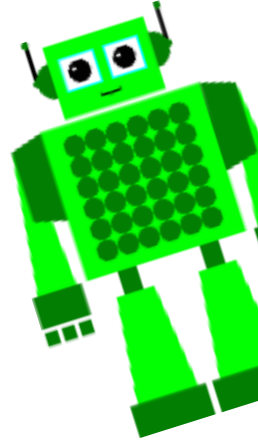
## Apostrophes for Plural Possession



A plural means that there is more than one of something. If the plural noun ends in an s, you add an apostrophe at the end of the word to show possession e.g. The girls' trainers were muddy. If the plural noun does not end in an s you add 's at the end of the word to show possession e.g. The men's shoes were clean.
