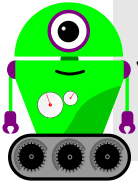


Fronted Adverbials



An adverbial is a word or phrase that gives more information about a verb. A fronted adverbial is when the adverbial is moved to the start of a sentence before the verb e.g. Earlier today, I walked to the post box.

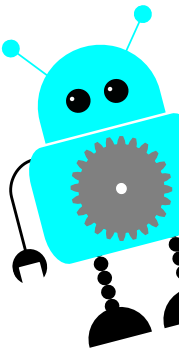
