Expanded Noun Phrases



An expanded noun phrase tells us more about a noun. We can make expanded noun phrases by adding adjectives and prepositional phrases. A noun phrase is 'a cottage' but an expanded noun phrase is 'an attractive cottage with colourful flowers growing in the garden'.


