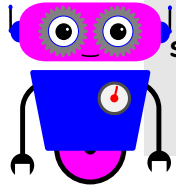


## Question Tags



A question tag is when a question is added to the end of a statement. If the statement is positive, the question tag is negative e.g. You can ski, can't you? If the statement is negative, the question tag is positive e.g. Eddie doesn't like spiders, does he? Question tags are separated from the statement with a comma.
