Subjects and Objects

A sentence has a subject and a verb but it may also have an object. The subject is the person or thing that performs the verb. The object is the person or thing that the verb is done to. The object usually comes after the verb. In the sentence 'The snake ate the mouse.' The snake is the subject because it ate the mouse and the mouse is the object because it was the thing that was eaten by the snake.




